 Take the time to learn the different trees growing here...once you've learned 3 (use Woodland Trust Tree ID-British trees app), play a game of Tree Tag! One person calls out a kind of tree as 'home', and everyone has to run to it without getting caught!

 See the little hill through the woods? These are the remains of a 13th Century Motte & Bailey Castle...see if you can climb to the top! Can you hear the rooks nesting above you?

 Climb the oak! See if you can walk all the way across...

 Across the bridge, play PooH sticks! Everyone picks a stick to race, the first to come out the other side wins!

 The stone circle is a perfect place to play the Sparrowhawk Game. One person stands in the middle with one arm (and their eyes) pointed dead-ahead. They must then turn in a very slow circle...Every other player needs to try to go once around
